We believe these advancements are the result of a focused approach to teaching and learning, along with targeted support strategies that cater to each student's needs. Our dedicated teachers have worked diligently to implement effective instructional practices, and their commitment is clearly reflected in these outstanding results.

We want to extend our heartfelt thanks to our students for their perseverance and effort, and to our parents for their ongoing encouragement and involvement. Together, we are building a strong foundation for continued academic success.

#### **Teacher Replacement**

Teacher absence from school is unavoidable and can sometimes be unpredictable. Where possible, the school will provide the best replacement learning opportunities whenever staff are absent,

despite the frequent difficulties of locating appropriate casual relief teachers.

At all times, the school aims to provide a consistent approach to curriculum delivery, so that all students access equal learning opportunities.

For this reason, if a replacement teacher cannot be provided, the school may use a variety of ways to ensure students still access quality learning programs and their educational needs are met during teacher absence. These include:

- Using a variety of teachers (including Leadership, tutors etc) throughout the day who may have a spare teaching session to teach the class.
- Cancelling a specialist class (if this does not affect the quarantined planning time for teachers) to cover the class.
- Splitting the class between the same/similar year level where the students can join in the work of that class

Victorian students in Years 3, 7 and 9 improved on their 2023 reading results, reversing the national trend, which saw the average score reading decline in Years 3, 5 and 7 and improve only at Year 9. Victoria's reading performance improved overall in 2024, with 5,000 more students reaching the 'exceeding' proficiency level for reading across all year levels compared to 2023.

**Bullying No Way** 

#### Areas for improvement

There is work to be done to improve outcomes for disadvantaged students, Aboriginal students, and students outside metropolitan areas. Victorian students in these cohorts achieved stronge learning outcomes than in other states and territories, but there are still significant gaps to close. We also need to lift outcomes for our secondary students.



The National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence has a new name-Bullying No Way: National week of action.

Bullying No Way Week, 12 to 16 August 2024, is Australia's key bullying prevention initiative and connects schools and communities to find workable solutions to prevent bullying. The week gives schools and supporters flexibility to plan activities that suit their schedule—whether it's spreading awareness throughout the week or focusing on an impactful day or two. Our school completed learning activities in the classroom to support their learning about bullying and how to respond to bullying. We regularly revisit bullying if it arises and do full investigations whenever an allegation is made.

#### What schools can do to prevent bullying...

Establishing a school culture that is clearly pro-learning, and where all members of the school community receive and communicate clear, coherent messages that 'this is a place of learning where violence is neither accepted or expected' is a powerful step towards preventing bullying.

Bullying prevention needs to be an ongoing aspect of a school system.

#### **Be proactive**

Cultures of cooperation do not occur by chance. They need to be planned for and created. Schools should establish key values of the school and live them, coherent messages and deliver them. They should review the structures of the school and look for opportunities to enhance positive relationships between staff, parents and students.

#### What parents can do as a first step

The most powerful ally a parent has in terms of dealing with bullying is their child's school. This means that all schools recognise it as a serious problem with negative consequences, and staff receive training on how to deal with it effectively.

Parents' first step should be to speak to the school. You do not need to ask your child's permission to speak to their school. Understandably children who are being bullied are often fearful and worry that any action will worsen the problem. They may try to talk you out of speaking to the school. The solution is to make a parental decision to talk to the school. You can always let your child know later what actions you have taken. Please see the following useful website for more information:

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**Develop a Bullying Prevention Policy** 

Lalor North Primary School has a Bullying Prevention Policy that has been developed in consultation with our student leaders. Students described bullying as...

"Bullying is when someone repeatedly uses their power to hurt or scare others. It can be done by an individual or by a group. It can be carried out physically, emotionally or verbally. People bully because they feel bad about themselves or to gain popularity and sometimes even for pleasure."

Every government school in Victoria has a bullying prevention policy.

#### What doesn't work in stopping bullying


Strategies that do **not** work with bullying include:

- fighting back
- bullying the bully
- ignoring it and not telling someone
- just playing with a different group of students
- remaining silent about the problem.

## The Importance of 10 Minutes a Day

#### Did you know that just 10 minutes of reading a day will change your child's life?

While that may seem like a big statement to make, numerous studies have consistently shown that 10 minutes exposure to reading materials each day is all it takes to positively shape your child's future.

And this doesn't just include complicated educational texts any reading materials, be it comic books, novels, picture books, recipes, magazines or the back of food packets, all count towards your child's daily reading goal.


Reading any of these materials for 10 minutes a day exposes your child to more than 600,000 words in one year—interestingly, that's more than double the word exposure of a child who only reads for 5 minutes or less each day.

How can you ensure that you can comfortably set aside some time each day to help your child reach their reading goal?

We've put together a few reading tips to help:

- Look through Book Club catalogues with your child and talk about the books you would like to read together. Discuss what you think the books might be about.
- Be a reading role model and let your child see you reading for enjoyment, for news and for information in cookbooks, magazines, online etc. This way they see that reading is important for many reasons.
- Assign a place in your home for your family's books to show your child that books are special and deserve an organised storage space. Fill your home with lots of reading materials.
- If space allows, create a special area for your child to dedicate to reading. Make sure your child puts aside phones, tablets and any other devices that may form a distraction.
- Tie books and TV/movies together. For example, read about sea life after watching a nature documentary on the ocean.
   Or, connect books and experiences together. For example, after a school excursion to the zoo, read books about animals.






